Stacy Peardot-Goudy

Stacy Peardot-Goudy is an agility veteran whose dogs have earned the entire alphabet soup of agility titles (O-NATCH x 2, ADCH x 7, MACH2, GM, RM, SM, JM, U-AG I, U-AG II, etc.). Stacy has qualified for the USDAA Grand Prix of Dog Agility the last 11 years in a row, and finished in 4th place in the 26" height division of the 2000 USDAA Nationals with Secret. Stacy and Secret were once again finalists in the 2003 Grand Prix World Championships as well as the 2001 and 2002 Grand Prix World Championships. 2003 also brought a 7th place finish in the AKC National Championships. Stacy earned Grand Champion status 3 years in a row at the NADAC National Championships with her dog Secret, the youngest dog to ever win the National Championship. In 1999 both Jack and Secret were members of winning Dog Agility Master team events, as well as ranking in the USDAA top 10 rankings. Secret is throughout her career has been a top 10 dog cumulatively in all 4 categories. In 2001 Stacy and Secret competed in the ESPN Great Outdoor Games taking the Silver medal in large dog agility. Stacy and Blitz came home with the Bronze medal. Stacy is the only competitor to show 2 dogs at the games and medal with both! Stacy and Secret were members of the 2001 USDAA Spring Festival of Dog Agility Masters team tournament winning team and she and her Border Collie Blitz were members of the second place team. Stacy and Secret were selected to compete in the first ever FCSI dog agility tournament in Russia in March 2002 and came home individual Gold medalist for the Maxi dog division as well as being a member of the American team who captured gold. Secret competed in Valencia, Spain at the 2004 World Agility Championships and captured the Silver medal for All Around Individual as well as the Gold in the Steeplechase and Individual Snooker classes. Secret was the Bronze medallist in the BiAthlon event and Power and Speed classes. The 2002 Sporting Dog Challenge saw Stacy and Secret take the 1st place honors and they were once again members of the winning DAM team at the Lexington Spring Festival of Dog Agility held April 2002. The 2002 Great Outdoor Games were a huge success once again as Stacy and Secret won the Silver medal for the second year in a row! Stacy is currently competing with Able and Rumor who are both USDAA Top 10 dogs in multiple categories for both Tournament Top 10 and Championship Top 10. Stacy and Able have earned a spot on the 2006 IFCS World Championship team that will compete in May in Oosterhout, Holland.

She started in agility with her Boxers 17 years ago and is currently training and competing with Secret a 10 year old Border Collie, Able a 6 year old Border Collie, Xtra a 6 year old Border Collie and, Beep! a 2 year old Border Collie. Stacy has trained, shown, and, titled dogs from 4 different groups including Aussies, Border Collies, Jack Russell Terriers, Boxers, and, a German Wirehaired Pointer. Stacy is currently a USDAA judge. She owns C SPOT WIN Dog Training in LaPorte, CO. Has co-authored along with Bud Houston Go the Distance, a workbook to teach your dog to work away, and has produced DVD's Go The Distance Vol. 1 and 2. Stacy has presented seminars and workshops throughout the United States, Canada, Bermuda and Australia she conducts agility camps in Castle Rock, Colorado.
